Dear Ms. Trevelyan:

The Government of Chile, through the Ministry of Health, informs the commitment made with our citizens as part of the initiatives of the COP26 Health Program.

This commitment was published on the website of the Ministry of Health of Chile: [www.minsal.cl](http://www.minsal.cl) on November 8, 2021.

The Commitment refers to Sustainable Low Carbon Health Systems:

- Goal 2024: Determine the Carbon Footprint in scope I, II and III, in 100% of High, Medium and Low Complexity Hospital Establishments, dependent on Health Services nationwide.
- Goal 2025: Determine the gap in energy consumption (consumption of fossil fuels and firewood) and technologies (equipment), which increase the generation of Greenhouse Gases in High, Medium and Low Complexity Hospital establishments dependent on the Services of Health, based on the calculation of the Carbon Footprint.
- Goal 2025: There will be information and definition of the national baseline of incorporated carbon and operational carbon of new and existing health buildings.
- Goal 2030: There will be standardized sustainability criteria for all complexities of health buildings and limits will have been established on carbon emissions for health buildings.
- Goal 2030: New health buildings must publicly report their carbon footprint (incorporated carbon and operational carbon).

We hope that these commitments will be substantial and long-term contributions to protect the Health of the Chilean population, as well as contribute to supporting the objectives of the Paris Agreement.
